

Did you know that Rend Lake College offers dual enrollment classes to WHS students? Honestly, I feel like dual enrollment classes are a convenient opportunity that's usually overlooked. First of all, there are a few common misconceptions about what dual enrollment is. The first one being that most people think dual credit classes and dual enrollment classes are the same thing. After a detailed interview with our guidance counselor, Mrs. Witzel, I discovered that in dual credit classes, you are getting RLC credits along with WHS credits, but in dual enrollment classes, you are only getting college credits. The second option is one that people just don't realize how beneficial it can be. Any dual enrollment class that you take in high school, will only cost you half the price that it would have cost you to take it in college. To give an estimate, Mrs. Witzel stated "A usual class at Rend Lake would probably cost around \$300, but if you take the class in high school, you would only have to pay \$150." If you plan to take out a college loan, those classes could save you much more than you think. If you do choose to take the dual enrollment classes, you will actually leave school around noon, and drive to RLC to attend. Mrs. Witzel also mentioned that "Students tend to really enjoy just the freedom and independence of getting to leave school, drive themselves to Rend Lake, and take a class in an actual college setting." Now, not just anyone can take these classes, there are a few requirements. These include: being sixteen or older, having a 3.8 GPA by the end of your junior year, being accepted into RLC, and having all the required paperwork (registration, application, parental signature). For those eligible, classes start the second semester of your senior year. If anyone is interested in taking these dual enrollment classes, stop by Mrs. Witzel's office and she'd be happy to get you a jump on college life!
