



Mrs. Montgomery is excited about a world tour of sorts in Art History. Students recently created cave art from paper textured with sand and charcoal She plans to investigate Mesopotamian, Egyptian, and Greco-Roman art this semester. There is something about a new course that really sparks the imagination and brings energy to a school environment. But whatever you do, just don't call these teachers at WHS old dogs they've always got some new tricks up their sleeves.
