

REGISTERING TO VOTE IN ILLINOIS



If you are 17 years old you can register and vote in a primary as long as you will be 18 years old by the following regular election.

By mailing in an application to your election authority's office. Download the paper application at www.elections.il.gov

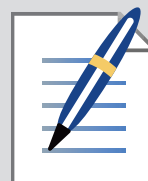
Forms of identification

Two forms of identification with at least one showing your current residence address are needed.



- Driver's license
- State ID
- Utility bill
- Bank statement
- Paycheck or government check
- Government document that shows name and address
- ID card from college with piece of mail

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS



- U.S. Citizen
- 17 years of age to vote in a primary if the individual will be 18 by the time of the upcoming Consolidated or General Election
- Must have been a resident of the precinct at least 30 days prior to Election Day

What if I move?

You can register at the college you are attending or at your previous permanent address.

You can re-register at your new address online, in-person, or by mail.

If you forget to re-register within 27 days before the election, you can still register and vote in-person through grace period registration and voting.
